Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) Overview



Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) allows a student the opportunity to earn college credit for learning done outside of the classroom.



Prior Learning Credit may include:

- Significant work or volunteer experience in the area which you are seeking credit.
- State, national, or industry certifications that define your learning experience.
- Advanced Placement exams taken while in high school.
- Articulating and documenting the learning you received as a result of your experiences.

Transcript and Transfer Information

Any credit earned through PLA will be reflected on the transcript as a "CR" for each course.

This credit can fulfill degree requirements but may not be transferable to other colleges.

PLA credit earned through another institution is subject to review through the Records Office. Information about transfer credit policy and procedures can be found on the Board Policy Manual.

Graduation Requirements

The amount of PLA credit that may be applied toward a degree is subject to Owens graduation requirements. Graduation requirements can be found on the Board Policy Manual.

Fees

All PLA fees for active duty military and veterans will be waived. Active duty or veteran status must be submitted to the Veteran Services Office. Information can be found on the Veteran Services website at owens.edu/veterans.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Advanced Placement (AP) – The College Board's AP Program offers a student the ability to earn college credit by exam for multiple courses while in high school. A student with an AP exam score of 3 or above will be awarded the aligned course credit. A student who wishes to obtain AP credit should request scores be sent to Owens Community College using school code 1643. A student can request this through the College Board website at apstudents.collegeboard.org or by calling 888-225-5427. AP test scores may also be submitted on an official high school transcript.

College Level Examination Program (CLEP) – The College Board's CLEP exams offers a student the ability to earn college credit for knowledge and skills learned outside of the classroom. A student who passes these exams with a minimum score will receive college credit. A student can view the available exams, minimum scores, testing locations, and pricing at the College Board's CLEP website at clep.collegeboard.org. At the time of the CLEP exam, a student who wishes to obtain CLEP credit should request scores be sent to Owens Community College using school code 4367 for Toledo or school code 4819 for Findlay.

CLEP Fees

PROFICIENCY EXAMS

Proficiency exams are developed by Owens Community College faculty and academic administration to allow a student to demonstrate competency for a course without enrolling in it. Students are encouraged to talk with their academic advisor and/or the Advisor, PLA Specialist about the process. A list of available tests and fees are available at howens.edu/testing/prof. Credit will be reflected on the transcript as a "CR" for each course. This credit can fulfill degree requirements but may not be transferable to other colleges.

Proficiency Eligibility

Students must meet the following requirements to take a proficiency:

- Student must not have already attempted the exam.
- Student must have completed all steps through admissions and is eligible for registration.
- Student must meet the course pre-requisites for the proficiency selected.

Proficiency Test Location and Scheduling

To apply for a proficiency examination and schedule an appointment, please contact Testing Services by calling (567) 661-8378 or by stopping into one of the Testing Centers on the Toledo-area and Findlay-area campuses. A Testing Specialist will determine a student's eligibility for a proficiency exam. Proficiency exams can be administered at the Toledo-area and Findlay-area Testing Centers during business hours.

DSST EXAMS

DSST exams are nationally standardized exams. A student who passes the DSST exam with a minimum score is awarded college credit. Students can view the exams available, minimum scores, locations, and pricing at the DSST website at a getcollegecredit.com. At the time of the DSST exam, a student who wishes to obtain DSST credit should request scores be sent to Owens Community College using school code 4367. A student who wishes to obtain previous DSST exams should download the order form from the DSST website.

Military Transcripts ()

Military Transfer Assurance Guides (MTAG)

Military Transfer Assurance Guides (MTAG) provide a statewide guarantee that certain types of military training, coursework, and/or experience will transfer as an existing college course. MTAG coursework currently aligns with the state's Ohio Transfer Module (OTM), Transfer Assurance Guides (TAGs), and CareerTechnical Assurance Guides (CTAGs). A student with experience or coursework not covered by the MTAG system should contact the College's Office of Veterans Services. A student must submit their military transcripts for evaluation through the Records Office.

Military Transcript Requests

Army, Navy, Coast Guard and Marine Corps

Submit an official Joint Services Transcript. To request a Joint Services Transcript be sent electronically to Owens, visit \ \ Jst.doded.mil/.

Air Force Personnel and Veterans

Request an official transcript from the Community College of the Air Force for work taken as an undergraduate. Community College of the Air Force transcripts may be ordered by sending a request in writing to: CCAF/RRR, 130 West Maxwell Blvd., Maxwell AFB AL 36112-6613, (334) 953-2794 (DSN 493-2794) or visit: Airuniversity.af.edu/Barnes/CCAF/.

Course Credit Verification ()

A student that has a valid state approved certification or apprenticeship may be eligible to earn credit. A student is encouraged to talk with their academic advisor and/or the Advisor, PLA Specialist about the process. A student must provide documentation of their certification as part of the verification process.

Course Credit Verification Fee

There is a \$50 processing fee for each Course Credit Verification form submitted.

Portfolio Assessment ()

Owens Community College recognizes that a student may come to the college with knowledge and skills gained through life experience. Portfolio-based assessment provides a method by which a student can document the experience. Documentation within the portfolio must contain evidence of college-level learning that matches the student learning outcomes of a given course. Applying for credit does not guarantee credit will be awarded. The Advisor, PLA Specialist will assist the student in the portfolio process, however it is the student's responsibility to construct and write the portfolio. A student is encouraged to talk to their academic advisor and/or the Advisor, PLA Specialist about the process. Credit will be reflected on the transcript as a "CR" for each course. This credit can fulfill degree requirements but may not be transferable to other colleges.

FastPathOhio

A student who wants to attempt to earn credit by completing a portfolio should create an account at fastpathohio.com. Available courses eligible for portfolio assessment is listed at fastpathohio.com.

Portfolio Fees

Each portfolio submitted for evaluation will be charged a \$50 assessment fee. There is a fee of \$50 for each credit hour earned, per portfolio submitted.

Skills Assessment 🕟

Skills-based assessments are developed by Owens Community College faculty and academic administration to allow a student to demonstrate hands-on competency for a course without enrolling in it. Please contact the Advisor, PLA Specialist to check which courses offer a skills assessment. Credit will be reflected on the transcript as a "CR." This credit can fulfill Owens degree requirements but may not be transferable to other colleges or universities.

Skills Assessment Fees

Any skills assessment attempted will incur a \$50 assessment fee. There is a fee of \$50 per credit hour for credit earned per course. All PLA fees are waived for student veterans."
