

GEOGRAPHY TRANSFER PATHWAY Associate of Arts

Geography is the study of physical and human landscapes on the earth's surface. It is an extremely broad academic discipline that encompasses nearly all of the social, natural and environmental sciences. As a result, geography often appeals to people who have a wide range of interests.

Geographers are trained to understand the complexity of interrelationships between people and the environment. In a globalizing world, geographic knowledge and the ability to analyze information from a variety of sources is becoming an increasingly valuable commodity in the job market.

We have umbrella agreements with the University of Toledo and Bowling Green State University. All four of the Geography courses that we offer at Owens – GPH 106, GPH 108, GPH 110 and GPH 206 – are TAGd; and are also Ohio Transfer Module Courses.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES FOR 4-YEAR GRADUATES

Since geography is a broad academic discipline encompassing nearly all of the social, natural and environmental sciences, people with geography degrees work in a wide variety of careers. Geography careers include: Park Ranger, Meteorologist, Urban Planner, Land Surveyor, Real Estate Appraiser, Military Intelligence, Emergency Dispatcher, Travel Guide, Social Studies Educator, Data Analyst, Cartographer and Demographer for the US Census Bureau. Geographers specializing in GIS (Geographic Information Systems) are employed by an array of public and private organizations. For example, utility companies employ GIS professionals, as do city planning offices and police and fire departments. Retail stores and restaurants also employ Geographers and GIS professionals to analyze sales trends. American Eagle clothing company, for example, uses GIS to better understand which clothing styles sell best from state-to-state and region-to-region. In 2012, the Bureau of Labor Statistics projected a 29 percent increase in geography jobs through 2022.
