JOB OPPORTUNITIES

The CPA Qualifying Credit program provides bachelor's degree-holding recipients the required coursework to sit for the Ohio CPA exam. There are 150 semester credit hours required to sit for the Ohio CPA examination, from which candidates must earn appropriate credits.

SALARY

The U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics for the Toledo area, reports the mean annual salary for accountants and auditors is \$62,670.

The Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Services estimates that the demand for accountants and auditors in Ohio will grow 7.78% between 2014 and 2024.
