JOB OPPORTUNITIES FOR GRADUATES

The Emergency Services Technology Program prepares graduates to find positions with federal, state and local fire departments, and ambulance services companies. Additionally, it prepares graduates to earn certifications as a Nationally Registered Paramedic and Firefighter II.

Emergency medical technicians (EMTs) and paramedics care for the sick or injured in emergency medical settings. People's lives often depend on their quick reaction and competent care. EMTs and paramedics respond to emergency calls, performing medical services and transporting patients to medical facilities.

Firefighters control and extinguish fires or respond to emergency situations where life, property, or the environment is at risk. Duties may include fire prevention, emergency medical service, hazardous material response, search and rescue, and disaster assistance.

SALARY

The Bureau of Labor Statistics Association website states that the average entry level income for a Firefighter in Ohio was \$49,080 in 2017. The average entry level hourly wage of Firefighters in Ohio was \$23.60 in 2017. The average entry level income for a Paramedic in Ohio was \$33,380 in 2017. The average entry level hourly wage of Paramedics in Ohio was \$16.05 in 2017.
