Dental Hygiene Program
Expanded Functions Dental Auxiliary (EFDA)

All graduates will be eligible to take the Ohio Dental Assisting Certification Exam.

The Dental Assisting Certificate is designed to prepare graduates for positions in private dental offices; hospitals; federal, state and municipal health departments; correctional institutions; dental clinics; or in the armed forces. Dental assistants work in a variety of office situations, both specialty and general practice, performing office and clinical assisting duties. Duties can include: assisting the dentist with examinations and fillings; preparing and sterilizing instruments; exposing and organizing radiographs; maintaining infection control; performing laboratory procedures; and performing reception and office management procedures. The Certificate Program provides the student with opportunities to acquire knowledge in the area of dental terminology, dental materials, radiography, and chairside assisting. Classroom sessions are complemented by planned practical experiences in the on-campus and off-site dental clinic and dental offices.

This certificate is approved by the Department of Higher Education and is financial aid eligible.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES FOR GRADUATES

Dental Assisting offers opportunities with excellent job placement and flexible scheduling. Dental assistants work in general and specialty dental offices, alternative career opportunities are available. These include public health departments, community programs and clinics, teaching institutions, nursing homes, business and industry, research, consumer advocate, and consulting.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

18 students are admitted a Fall Evening Cohort and 18 students are admitted for a Spring Daytime Cohort. The Fall Cohort Health Evaluation Applications are evaluated in May and the Spring Cohort Health Evaluation Applications are evaluated in October.

- Students must submit an application to be accepted in the Dental Assisting Certificate.

- Students must have any developmental courses completed in reading to be accepted in the Dental Assisting Certificate.
- Students must have a 2.0 GPA by the end of the 1st Semester and be college ready in reading.
- Students entering the Dental Assistant Certificate must have current certification in Basic Life Support for Health Care Providers and meet health requirements.
- Students who do not qualify for admission can reapply in following years. Students may take Arts and Sciences courses as specified by the Dental Assisting Certificate. Upon successful completion of these courses, the students may apply for entrance into the Dental Assisting Certificate. Contact the Academic Advising Office for more information.
